FILMS IN FEBRUARY

The Western Development Museum - Moose Jaw and the Yorkton Film Festival are pleased to offer a series of Canadian film in February.

The series begins on Saturday, February 6 at 2:00 pm with *Soldier's Stories: Voices from the Great War*. Showing will be *Front Lines*, which uses archival footage and letters home to create a vivid picture of the physical and emotional hardships of the front line soldier. The film will be followed by a presentation by Dr. Ian Germani, Professor, Department of History at the University of Regina. Specializing in the relationship between war and culture in European history, Dr. Germani's research has focused on the French revolution and the First World War.

On Saturday, February 13, celebrate Heritage Day with an eclectic series of films about Canada from pre-Confederation to the 2010 Olympics.

Most Canadians have immigrated to Canada from other shores. On February 20, through film we will look at the successes and challenges of many immigrants and of Canada's immigration policy.

The series concludes on Saturday, February 27 with *Camp X*, a film on the intelligence communities during the Second World War. Canada's involvement in wartime spying may surprise you.
