## Save the 1158!

*“My great-grandparents stepped off ships in New York City during the First World War. My war bride Grandma and my Dad, just a year and a half old, came to Pier 21 in Halifax in 1946. It was steam locomotives that brought them 2,000 miles west to build their new lives.”*

Steam locomotives. They brought so many people to Saskatchewan and were a lifeline for new and swiftly growing communities.

Locomotive 1158 stands at the WDM North Battleford Heritage Farm and Village as a larger than life reminder of the past. The railway, powered by steam locomotives, reduced the massive geography of Canada, bringing millions of people to new homes. The locomotive was truly the vehicle of immigration.

60 years of rain, sun and wind have been hard on the 1158 locomotive. It's a huge job. At \$200,000, it's the biggest artifact restoration the WDM has undertaken in many years. You can save the 1158 with your gift today to the Save the 1158! campaign at the Western Development Museum. We already have 60% of the funds we need. You can help us get the remaining \$80,000.

### ***Our Collective Threads: Saskatchewan People in Canada***



As part of the year-long Canada 150 celebrations, the WDM has produced an exciting travelling exhibit. *Our Collective Threads* explores the diverse history of Saskatchewan people through artifacts from its exceptional textile collection. The clothes we have worn tell many stories about everyday life in Saskatchewan and our place in Canada.

One artifact featured is this pair of 1940s children's farm overalls. Little is known about who wore them. The patches on the knees and the back suggest hard times and making do. The faded-out signature GWG brand red stripe is reminiscent of a childhood spent in the hot prairie sun.

Advertised as "Just Like His Dad's," GWG's durable and affordable farm overalls for boys were a staple piece of clothing on the farm in the lean years of the 1930s and wartime 1940s. For young immigrants new to Saskatchewan, owning a pair meant fitting in. Boys wore their overalls all four seasons – over flannel shirts and with wool socks in winter and bare-chested with no shirt in summer.

## Ready to Roll

In November 2016, the WDM began to restore the Waterous road roller that was on display outside the WDM Moose Jaw. Over the past few months, staff and volunteers have worked to return it to its former glory.

The city of Saskatoon bought this 11,000 kg roller second-hand in Winnipeg in 1926 for \$2,950, the equivalent of about \$42,000 in 2017. It was used until 1933. Plans are underway for the roller to go back on display in Moose Jaw this year.
