Happy Autumn everyone!



New to the WDM Collection

The WDM recently accepted a large collection of Saskatchewan dairy products including milk bottles, cream cans, promotional materials, milk caps and ice cream tubs. This collection contains hundreds of artifacts and helps highlight many aspects of dairy and food history in Saskatchewan. It will be important for anyone who wishes to study aspects of everyday life from the 20th century such as food delivery, food production, marketing and family life.

These items are part of a much larger collection assembled by Robert "Dairy Bob" Snyder. The WDM accepted items relating to Saskatchewan while the Royal BC and Royal Alberta Museums took items relating to their respective provinces.

The collection will take a long time to process. Each item in the collection must be assigned an accession number and prepared for storage. Staff and volunteers have been working hard to label the artifacts.

These objects are a throwback to the days of home milk delivery and highlight a change in how people interact with and obtain their food. Today, home milk delivery is a rarity, whereas just a few decades ago it was the most common way for city dwellers to get their dairy!
