This summer, there are some changes to the WDM's usual line-up of activities as we tackle some big projects and wrap up others.

In Saskatoon, construction on the parking lot will be underway. This is a major infrastructure project that will cause some disruption as we install the needed drainage system to address the high-water table that is the root of all the parking lot problems. The WDM Saskatoon will remain open during construction and an alternate entrance is being prepared on the west side of the building.

Given the scope of the parking lot project and, in the interest of everyone's safety, we have decided not to hold Pion-Era this summer. Our other summer shows – Those Were The Days in North Battleford and the Threshermen's Show and Seniors' Festival in Yorkton – will have lots of great family activities to offer and I hope you take the opportunity to join us at these events.

The 1158 Locomotive in North Battleford will be back on display beside the train station having been completely restored over the past year. The restoration of the 1158 locomotive was a major undertaking and we are pleased that it is once again on display.

For the first time in two years, summer in Moose Jaw will be marked by the return of the Vulcan locomotive's whistle. The railway track has been repaired and visitors can once again ride the only operating steam locomotive in Saskatchewan. We will be re-launching the locomotive at a special opening on June 17, so come out and enjoy a day of family fun and train rides.

Coming for a visit to any one of our WDM locations is a great way to reconnect with family and friends. We hope a visit to one of the WDM locations will be a part of your family's summer memories this year.

FEATURE

Towards a New Parking Lot

Plans for fixing the Saskatoon parking lot have been underway for over 5 years. Last year, we committed to finishing the project in 2018. Repairing the parking lot is a major infrastructure project because of the high-water table in the area.

Continuing to make surface repairs to both the asphalt and gravel areas of the parking lot are no longer feasible. Patching asphalt and adding gravel has been done annually over the past 10 years and the repairs rarely last a full season. Correcting the poor drainage and lowering the water-table is the only long-term solution to the ongoing problems experienced in the parking lot.

Fixing this will require excavating the entire parking lot to install the necessary drainage systems before new curbs and asphalt can be added. As a result, the main entrance and parking lot will be inaccessible during construction. We are anticipating that construction will occur between July and October.

The WDM Saskatoon will remain open during construction. An alternate entrance to the Museum is being planned on the west side of the building and parking will be located in the Pioneer Circle. We are doing everything possible to keep the disruption to a minimum. Detailed signage and maps will be available to guide visitors to these alternate areas once construction begins.

The anticipated cost for this project is \$1.5 million. As part of our ongoing efforts to raise funds for this project, a \$2 infrastructure improvement fee is being instituted. This fee will be added to the cost of regular Museum admissions. WDM memberships will not be impacted by this surcharge.

We are excited to be moving forward on this project and while the construction will be disruptive, the end result will be a well designed and accessible parking lot.
